Catholic Sisters in the Post-War Caribbean: Notes on a Recent Dissertation in History is the title of Elizabeth Mullins' talk at our January 7th general meeting. Professor Mullins teaches History and Women's Studies at Monterey Peninsula College in Monterey. Before becoming an historian she was a staff member in the Psychology Department at UCSC for six years. She left university service to go to graduate school in 2006. She received her Master's in History in 2009 and a Ph.D. in March 2014, both from UC Santa Cruz. Her dissertation explored the history of a group of Catholic Sisters who founded a girls' preparatory school in the Dominican Republic after WWII. The school hosted a truly unusual and interesting environment for young women in the Dominican Republic to become bilingual in English and Spanish and receive a degree recognized both by the U.S and Dominican Republic. The Sisters built, founded, and ran the school while struggling to balance the competing demands of U.S. officials, the Dominican education system, the Congregation's director, and the notorious dictator who ran the Dominican Republic until the 1960s, Rafael Trujillo.

On **February 4**th our speaker will be Nicole W. Douglas M.A., an environmental scientist and landscape architect.

The title of her talk is **Water Conservation and an Ecological Approach to Gardening**

Nicole Douglas is a Santa Cruz-based landscape designer and project manager with a focus on water conservation and an ecological approach to gardening. With two master's degrees in environmental science and a background in art and design, Nicole combines her expertise to create exquisite, water-wise, habitat gardens county-wide and beyond. Nicole loves to educate others on the topics that she is passionate about and gives regular lectures and presentations throughout the county on a variety of subjects relevant to sustainable landscape design. Members will learn more about California native and Mediterranean plants, water efficient irrigation, creating healthy soil, design tips and aesthetics, and more! Anyone with a yard of any size and/or interest in gardening will benefit from this presentation.

On March 4th Mike Ryan, Co-Artistic Director Santa Cruz Shakespeare, will speak about **The Second Season: Setting the Stage at Santa Cruz Shakespeare.**

Santa Cruz Shakespeare (SCS) is a new, independent non-profit theatre company rooted in Santa Cruz, and dedicated to the plays of William Shakespeare and other dynamic playwrights whose work celebrates language. SCS is carrying on the tradition of professional, thought-provoking and passionate theater in Santa Cruz.

After a very successful inaugural 2014 summer season the company is planning for 2015. Artistic Director Ryan will fill us in on the plays of the season and what creative surprises may be in store for audiences.

Mike first came to Santa Cruz in 1997 and launched a long career with Shakespeare Santa Cruz; he appeared in over 35 productions with the company before it was closed at the end of 2013. Bay Area audiences may also know him from performances with American Conservatory Theater, San Jose Repertory Theater, Jewel Theater Company and Aurora.

Mr. Ryan received his BFA from Southern Methodist University, where he was a National Merit Scholar, and his MFA from the University of California San Diego. From 2003 to 2009 he was a member of the acting faculty at UCSC. All of the meetings will be at 11:30 at the Arboretum.
