An Adventure in the Arts

If you enjoy classical music, architecture and the arts, consider taking one of Elderhostel's International trips to Europe.

This spring I signed up for the "Heartland of Classical Music" tour of Germany and Austria. Our tour began in Berlin and almost every evening our group of about 25 attended a concert or opera. An added bonus – the magnificent architecture, glorious museums and castles galore. East Berlin, now a very modern part of the city was a highlight with its contrast between the area as it was and the sleek modern buildings of the present. We heard the Berlin Philharmonic orchestra and enjoyed the opera Carmen

We traveled to Pottsdam, scene of the 1945 Pottsdam conference where Truman, Stalin and Atlee carved up sections of Europe; and to Munich's famed citty hall and site of the Glockenspiel Chimes where out pops traditional carved Bavarian dancers. Everyone in the square stops to admire these ancient little characters. In Munich we attended their Chamber orchestra featuring John Cage and to the Bavarian State Opera to see Lohengrin. And in Salzburg, Austria, we sat under the dome in the Cathedral and heard a choir of 200 sing to the music of a full orchestra...In Salzburg, our musical experience was the opera "Marriage of Figaro."

Final stop was magical Vienna. In Schubert's home we attended a private concert; saw a modern production of La Traviata at the Volksoper House, toured the Schonbrunn palace--the Hapsburg's winter palace and the Vienna National Opera House. We even rode the world's oldest ferris wheel and saw the Lippanzer horses.

The combination of music, architecture, museums featuring Picasso, Titian, Reubens, klimp, Schiel and others, elegant shopping, delicious pastries, German/Austrian food and beer were just beyond my expectations.
