At the intersection of Bay and High Streets (the main entrance of campus), proceed west along High Street, which turns into Empire Grade Road. Head towards the west entrance of the campus. Approximately one-half mile up High Street, you will see the Arboretum entrance on your right.

The lower parking area provides access to the Arboretum's gift shop Norrie's. Park in this lot if you would enjoy a walk to our meeting room. Following the road past Norrie's as it curves to the left, you'll find more parking adjacent to the Horticulture II building which includes the Conference Room where we will meet.

Parking at the Arboretum is limited and carpooling is strongly recommended.

Thank you to every member who contributed to our gourmet luncheons last year. There were many comments of appreciation for your creative and generous efforts. Last year, everyone had an opportunity to sign-up to bring food for a particular month (and some generously brought food several times during the year) thus enabling members to choose a time that was best for them. We will follow the same procedure this year.
