operating program, our scholarship program or a combination of the two.

By making a planned gift, you can leave money or assets to the Women's Club either in your will or through an investment that provides income to you now and ultimately benefits the Club. For example, a 70-year-old who set up a charitable gift annuity could get an approximate 5.7% (% based on age) annual return for life on her \$20,000 gift. You can easily integrate a planned gift into your overall financial, tax and estate planning. In some cases, you may realize significant financial gains in the form of a charitable tax deduction, and a planned gift made with appreciated property may help you bypass capital gains taxes.
