#### **February Meeting**



Cathleen Miller is a nonfiction writer and our speaker on February 5, 2014. Her latest work is *Champions of Choice*, named one of the top biographies of the year by the American Library Association.

Miller will be discussing this book. It is a biography of Nafis Sadik, an obstetrician, wife, mother and devout Muslim who has been a tireless advocate for women. She has insisted on discussing difficult issues that impact their lives. They include education, contraception, abortion, as well as rape and other forms of violence.

After Sadik joined the fledgling UN Population Fund in 1971, her groundbreaking strategy for providing females with education and tools to control their own fertility has dramatically influenced the global birthrate.

Champions of Choice is the first book to examine Sadik's contribution to history and the unconventional methods she has employed to improve millions of women's lives. It is the result of ten years of work and many, many strange circumstances.

Miller utilizes storytelling as a rhetorical device to demonstrate how the issues which affect one individual are representative of a larger world order. The personal is political.

#### **March Meeting**



Our UCSC Women's Club March speaker will be Professor Jon Pearce, Chair of the Computer Science Department at San Jose State University. He lives in Santa Cruz.

The topic of his presentation will be Artificial Societies. Modeling complex systems as artificial societies allows us to study the emergence of conformity, the outbreak of revolutions, the evolution of morality, and the spread of memes. (A **meme** is "an idea, behavior, or style that spreads from person to person within a culture".)
