2019 Scholarship Recipients

The 2019 scholarship luncheon was held at the La Feliz Room of the Seymour Center. Guests enjoyed the coastal view with a nice lunch, and they liked meeting the scholarship recipients who joined us and gave thanks for their awards. It's always amazing to learn about the students' backgrounds, motivations for education, and long-term goals.

With this year's awards, the Women's Club has awarded **481** scholarships for a total of **\$393,282** in the past 40 years. Scholarship monies given to students come from two sources: money raised directly to be awarded for scholarships and money that is interest income from our endowment. Fundraising Update

Our scholarships are awarded because of your generous donations to the Women's Club Scholarship Fund or the Rita Olsen Pister Scholarship Endowment. While you may make donations directly to one of the funds through opportunities such as Giving Day, you also contribute throughout the year with your participation in Community Night at the Shadowbrook or other fundraising opportunities.

The Club awarded \$30,000 in scholarships in spring 2019 from your generous donations. If you wish to make a tax deductible donation before the end of the current tax year, it is easy to do so on our website, womensclub.ucsc.edu, or write a check addressed to UCSC Foundation, and indicate whether you wish the funds to be deposited to the Women's Club Scholarship Fund (immediate use) or the Rita Olsen Pister Scholarship Endowment (investment for continuing use). The Financial Interest Group enlightens the members' experiences and understanding about a variety of topics of the members' choosing. Examples are trust and estate planning, life insurance and annuity strategies to benefit your financial plans, real estate trends, and long-term care. They also consider behavioral finance, exploring your personal beliefs and relationship with money. Sometimes topic experts present, in other cases the group leader, Jane McKenzie, leads the discussion. They have 7 to 8 meetings per year with the summer off. Most important, the group has agreed to maintain the confidentiality of members' questions and personal stories due to the nature of the topics.
