The Art of Wildlife Photography Steve Mandel on January 6, 2016



This presentation will feature Steve Mandel's wildlife photos from around the globe. He will talk about how good wildlife images follow the same artistic principles which have been in place for over 35,000 years, the time of the classic cave paintings. He will discuss the plight of many of the animals he has photographed that are rapidly disappearing from the wild, and what can be done to help efforts to save them.

Steve was one of the pioneers in the use of digital photography in 1996 for taking pictures of galaxies, supernovae, and other astronomical objects. And, in 2007, he made some discoveries that led to him receiving the top global award for amateur contributions to astrophysics. In addition to using his photography in the interest of wildlife conservation, Steve formed a nonprofit for the protection of the Asiatic Lion in India. His wildlife photos have been displayed for the past five years in the Smithsonian Natural History Museum. His images have appeared as book covers, in magazines, and newspapers globally.

Along with his wife Carol Foote, an accomplished photographer in her own right, Steve loves exploring wild places in the world and photographing the remarkable animals that share the earth with us.

Flora Lu on February 3, 2016



Flora Lu is the Provost of Colleges Nine and Ten. She is a professor of Environmental Studies.

Specializing in Ecological Anthropology, she studies the interrelationships between human societies and the natural environment with a geographic emphasis in the Amazon. She integrates social and natural science approaches to study resource use and conservation among indigenous peoples and migrant populations in Ecuador with a focus on land use, social change, cultural resilience, and household economic strategies.

We Are Fifty!

That is, the UCSC Women's Club will be 50 this year. The first meeting was held on April 1, 1966, one year after the UCSC campus opened. Originally it was formed to welcome newcomers who had come to Santa Cruz from all over the country. It was open to women faculty and staff, and wives of faculty and staff. There were 41 members.

Eleven years later the club's by-laws were changed to allow non-University associate members to join. The first scholarship was awarded in 1976, and scholarships have continued for 40 years.

Originally there were no dues. Members met for tea and dessert at an annual meeting; interest groups met frequently. One of the oldest groups is the Garden Club and it thrives today. Other groups were Book Club 1, a Furniture Exchange, a Baby Sitting Co-op, a Gourmet group and a Beach Walkers group. A popular outing was a holiday shopping and sightseeing trip to San Francisco.

We have this information from an article Hazel Powell wrote in 2009 after interviewing the three surviving original members, Emily Clark, Kay Wagstaff and Evelyn Casolari. They are no longer with us. In this, our 50th anniversary year it would be good to learn more about the early days of the club. We would be happy to hear from anyone who can contribute to our history. Perhaps the next newsletter will tell us more.
