Seymour Marine Lab

A 45-minute window into the fascinating world of ocean science, explore the many interactive exhibits, aquaria, the Ocean Discovery Shop, and enjoy the ocean view.

Arboretum and Botanic Garden Tour

Participants enjoy a walking tour, led by the executive director, through displays of plants designed to thrive in our local climate and in-home landscapes. Explore gardens designed by expert curators and learn ways to cultivate conservation minded gardens in your own home. New highlights this year are the succulent garden and an ecological art exhibit highlighting the impacts of climate change on native plants.

A short walk through Central Campus to visit McHenry Library

Exhibits include a look at the avant-garde Fluxus art movements influence on art education on campus, a celebration of the 1969 founding of UCSC's College 5 (which became Porter College), and an exploration of the people and the novel business practices behind the Grateful Dead's touring, publishing, record production, and community building enterprises.
